Jøtul launch the stunning new F470 Concept

Specialist wood burning stove manufacturer **Jøtul** has launched its stunning new range the F470 concept. Each freestanding model in cast iron features a distinctive tear drop shape with large curved glass door that slides seamlessly upwards in a guillotine opening mechanism. This unique design feature allows easy access to restocking the burn chamber in both an innovative and practical way.

There are five variations of the F470 concept: **Jøtul F 471** includes in its cast iron base a removable shelf for wood storage, **Jøtul F 473** (pictured right) includes a pedestal base and optional turn plate which enables the stove to be rotated 360° when fitted with a top flue outlet making the flames visible from every corner of the room, **Jøtul F 474** (pictured left) has a tear drop shaped pillar base providing an elegant finish to the overall design, **Jøtul F 475** features a cast iron base with an opaque black glass door, concealing the storage area and projecting a subdued flame reflection into the room, and finally the **Jøtul F 476** which includes soap stone sides which not only accumulate the heat, but also provide an additional design feature for the perfect 'heating furniture' finish.
